In 1988 Genevieve Miller, Prof. Judith MacMillan and Dr. Donald Stafford had a mission and a musical dream. Their goal was to establish a chorale to "perform fine choral music in the most professional way possible." The Cherokee Chorale was born and has continued to delight audiences. We have grown in quality and quantity. Last season, our Christmas concert boasted over 100 auditioned singers who shared their dedication and passion for song. Members of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra and other professional musicians from the larger community have honored the Chorale with superior orchestral accompaniment.

Over the years we have performed works by Bach, Beethoven, Mozart, Rutter, Saint-Saens, Vivaldi, Mendelssohn and many other composers and arrangers. Our music has taken us to Asheville to sing at the Biltmore Estates' Candlelight Christmas, to Riverfest Festival in Canton, to the dedication of the National Cemetery in Cherokee County, and to the Bruton Parish Church in Williamsburg, Virginia. Over the years we have had guest conductors, soloists, and choirs from colleges and all levels of the local public schools perform in our concerts. A Partner in Education, we actively support Cherokee County schools and Reinhardt University with grants and scholarships.

The Chorale presents three major performances each season: a Christmas concert in December, a Spring concert in March, and a Pops concert in May or June.

Scott L. Martin is in his third season as principal conductor of The Cherokee Chorale. Mr. Martin holds a Master of Music Education degree from The University of Georgia and a Bachelor of Music Education degree from Shorter College, where he was a voice student of John Ramsaur, a conducting student of John Ratledge, and a NATS winner.

Currently the choral teacher at Creekview High School in Canton, Mr. Martin's Creekview choirs have been selected to perform for multiple Georgia Music


Educator's Association conferences as well, as state and regional American Choral Directors Association conferences. Professional memberships include the National Association for Music Education, Georgia Music Educator's Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, and the American Choral Director's Association, where he is the past GA ACDA Repertoire and Resources Chair for High School Choirs, and currently serves as State Choral Chair for GMEA. In addition to his choir directing duties he is a frequent guest soloist and a former member of the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra Chorus and the Atlanta based chamber choir Coro Vocati. Mr. Martin co-founded the Orpheus Men's Ensemble, a chamber choir of local choral directors and church music directors.

He resides in Canton with his wife, Laura, children Joseph, Emily, and Grace.



Maggie Lovell, Harpist, Adjunct Professor of Harp at Auburn University and the University of Alabama in Huntsville

Maggie Lovell holds a Bachelor of Music in Harp Performance, Master of Music in Harp Performance (with a cognate in Instrumental Conducting), and a Performer Diploma in Harp Performance, all from the acclaimed Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. She also served as an associate instructor in the IU harp department, teaching private harp lessons and a semester long class on basic harp maintenance and repair, while also maintaining the school's fourteen pedal harps. To prepare for this position, she completed an internship at the Lyon & Healy harp factory in Chicago.





masterclasses, camps for both adults and younger students, and for official events with the American Harp Society. Prior to moving to Alabama, Maggie was the harp instructor at the University of North Georgia in Dahlonega, Georgia. She has maintained private teaching studios in Tennessee, Georgia, and Alabama and features her students in periodic student recitals. She currently holds the position of Adjunct Professor of Harp at both Auburn University and the University of Alabama in Huntsville.

Maggie's great joy is to perform with orchestra and she keeps herself busy performing with orchestras and professional ensembles across the Tennessee Valley, including holding a position as guest principal for the Augusta Symphony in Augusta, Georgia. She is also engaged as a featured soloist with multiple professional choral ensembles in the area and performs with them regularly.

In addition to teaching and performing, Maggie is an avid arranger, transcriber, and typesetter. Her work has been featured in dozens of published works from well-known harpists, as well as other vocal and instrumental publications. She has a passion for religious music and often works on exciting new harp arrangements of popular Christian tunes.

Maggie's teachers were Distinguished Professor Susann McDonald and Professor Elzbieta Szmyt.

About A Ceremony of Carols

A Ceremony of Carols was written in 1942 when the English composer Benjamin Britten was 29 years old. It is one of the composer's most popular and widely performed works, particularly at the Christmas season. This masterwork was originally premiered by a women's choir and then subsequently revised and published as a work for treble choir and harp. In 1943, Britten created a SATB arrangement for mixed choir, which you will hear in today's concert. A Ceremony of Carols was composed in part during five weeks that Britten spent travelling by ship from New York to England during the Second World War. During the voyage the ship stopped in Halifax, Nova Scotia, where Britten purchased a book of medieval poetry. Poems from this book, along with Gregorian Chant and other poetry spanning 14th to 16th century England, were the inspiration for A Ceremony of Carols. The work was innovative in many respects, such as the use of harp as the sole accompanying instrument for a large, choral work.
